

Unlicensed, Unregistered, Inoperable, Dismantled, etc., Motor Vehicles Ordinance Ordinance # 34-Amended

Ordinance previously read:

Section 2: PARKING, STORAGE PROHIBTED EXCEPT WITHIN ENCLOSED BUILDING

No person shall cause unlicensed, unregistered, inoperable, dismantled or partially dismantled motor vehicle(s) or part(s) thereof to be parked, placed or stored or permitted to remain on any premises, streets or roads in the Village of Freeport except those parked or stored within a fully enclosed permanent building.

Section 3: STORAGE OF VEHICLES, PARTS OR TIRES

Any unlicensed, unregistered, inoperable, dismantled or partially dismantled motor vehicle(s) and/or tire(s) and/or part(s) of motor vehicles may be stored in an orderly manner in the driveway or rear of a premises, but not in any case in a street, road or in front of a premises for a period not to exceed ten (10) days.

Ordinance to read as follows:

Section 2: ALLOWABLE PARKING, STORAGE OF UNLICENSED, UNREGISTERED, INOPERABLE, DISMANTLED OR PARTIALLY DISMANTED VEHICLES, PARTS OR TIRES FOR TEN (10) DAYS

Any unlicensed, unregistered, inoperable, dismantled or partially dismantled motor vehicle(s) and/or tire(s) and/or part(s) of motor vehicles may be stored in an orderly manner in the driveway or rear of a premise, but not in any case in a street, road or in front of a premises for a period not to exceed ten (10) days.

Section 3: PARTS, STORAGE PROHIBITED EXCEPT WITHING ENCLOSED BUILDING

No person following the up to ten (10) day allowable time period (Ordinance 34- Section 2)shall cause unlicensed, unregistered, inoperable, dismantled or partially dismantled motor vehicle(s) and/or tires(s) and/or parts of vehicles thereof to be parked, placed or stored or permitted to remain on any premises, streets or roads in the Village of Freeport except those parked or stored within a fully enclosed permanent building
